

ADI Jerusalem Residential Wing Renovation

Background

ADI was established in 1982 by a group of parents determined to give their children with severe disabilities the best care available, and the opportunity to develop to their full potential. This steadfast commitment has changed the face of rehabilitative care in Israel.

Today, ADI is the largest network of residential care in Israel serving individuals with severe disabilities. Over 750 children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and medical conditions have received advanced care in ADI's four residential facilities located throughout the country – Jerusalem, Bnei Brak, Gedera and the Negev. In addition, ADI provides over 40,000 outpatient treatments annually.

The ADI Jerusalem Center is much more than a facility. The Center is a warm and loving home founded on the belief that every individual is special, equally deserving of love and respect, entitled to the opportunity to develop to their fullest potential and enjoy a high quality of life. Its rehabilitative and educational frameworks provide comprehensive care and support within a medically safe environment to over 150 children and young adults. Every individual is challenged to discover his or her capabilities, learn and enjoy friendship, laughter and love.

Project Need

ADI Jerusalem opened its doors 22 years ago as a residential facility for 35 children. Since that time, it has more than doubled its size, significantly expanding its activity and scope and initiating community frameworks for children with severe disabilities living at home. These include a burgeoning special education school, child development center, rehabilitative daycare center, hydrotherapy pool and more.

The quality of care, professional staff, and ongoing technological advances in the field of special education and rehabilitation have earned ADI Jerusalem a reputation as a center of excellence for people with severe disabilities. From a single floor of activity, the ADI Jerusalem Center is now a five-story building utilizing every inch of space.

Project Budget

This project will renovate and adapt the bedrooms and bathrooms of the residential floor, to improve residents' quality of life, guard their right to privacy and strengthen personal attention by establishing small and intimate family-like settings.

Detailed planning for the renovations are complete; the project is ready to begin and we anticipate completing the renovations by the end of this year. Donations in the sum of CAD\$ 84,000 have already been raised toward this project.
